Social Emotional Learning



While teaching the youth of today, sometimes it's important to reinvent the wheel in order to fit the needs of every student. New teaching methods and philosophies are discovered everyday, so why not put them to use? Thom Stecher and Associates, the same people who bring to you the LifeSkills Conference, have put together a program to help administrators and educators understand effective ways to reach students of all ages. The program is called "Comprehensive Behavioral Health, Prevention & Intervention Training." The first seminar was held on November 29th, 30th, and December 1st, 2016, at the Masonic Conference Center—Patton Campus in Elizabethtown, PA.

One of the major focuses during this seminar was the importance of social and emotional learning, the process through which children and adults acquire and apply the skills necessary to understand and manage emotions, achieve positive goals, feel and show

empathy, establish and maintain positive relationships, and make responsible decisions. Some of the goals throughout this training are to develop a list of action strategies that can be introduced to their respective schools, identify current research of prevention and intervention strategies, and to develop a "tools for the toolbox" that can be taken to implement with their students and staff.

The first training seminar was well attended by several schools throughout the Eastern and Central Pennsylvania School Districts. A total of 53 administrators and educators attended in an effort to take back vital information to their schools. Thom Stecher and Associates, in partnership with the Pennsylvania Masonic Youth Foundation, plan to hold more seminars in the near future. Job's Daughters International changed their requirements of membership a year ago and allowed young ladies between the ages of 10-20 who are not related to Master Masons to join as long as they can find a Masonic sponsor to join a Bethel. While this was received as a positive with reservations of losing the direct relationship connection, it appears that this change was one that benefitted Pennsylvania Job's Daughters. The Bethels were able to initiate a total of 33 girls in 2016. Of those, 5 of them joined under Masonic Sponsorship. Masons stepping up and sponsoring the young ladies to join, allowed them opportunities to benefit from membership in a fraternal organization. By instituting the sponsorship concept, Pennsylvania Job's Daughters netted a positive growth of 10 new members for 2016. It just goes to show that even without that direct family relationship, a Masonic sponsor can help build the youth groups for tomorrow, and extend our "Masonic family."

Recognize an Eagle Scout



When a young man joins the Boy Scouts of America, the ultimate goal is for him to one day receive the Eagle Scout Award. The Eagle Scout is given for outstanding leadership and personal achievement. He must receive merit badges in multiple areas of interest, including first aid, personal management, cooking, camping and communications. He must also perform a service project which demonstrates leadership of others for the benefit of any religious institution, school or community. All of the requirements must be completed before the young man's 18th birthday.



The Right Worshipful Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons in Pennsylvania established the Daniel Carter Beard Award to honor Masons serving as scout leaders. The Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania has also authorized the distribution of a certificate signed by the Grand Master to be presented to a recipient of the Eagle Scout Award. Are You Eligible to Wear a Masonic Youth Apron?

To receive an apron on loan from the Pennsylvania Masonic Youth Foundation, a Master Mason must be a registered adult leader with a local Rainbow Assembly, Job's Daughters Bethel or DeMolay Chapter. The Foundation will distribute the apron upon the request of the Chairman of the local youth group. The Chairman will also sign for the


